What are the National Art Honor Societies

Since 1978, the National Art Honor Society Programs support student members in their efforts to attain the highest standards in art scholarship, character, and service. The National Art Honor Society (NAHS) or National Junior Art Honor Society (NJAHS) are more than "art clubs." Students are required to meet eligibility criteria for membership as detailed in your chapter's constitution and bylaws (see pages 6-8 for details).

HOW MUCH DOES AN NAHS/NJAHS CHAPTER COST?

To be established or renewed, each chapter is required to pay a sponsorship fee and student dues yearly.

Sponsorship Fee

A yearly sponsorship fee* is required for each NAHS/NJAHS chapter and entitles the chapter sponsor to all the benefits of one active NAEA membership, as well as all that comes with chapter sponsorship. Need to see the sponsor fee for your state? Reference the chart here.

Student Dues

Student dues are \$5 per student per year. Payment is due at the time of registration.

*The sponsorship fee is waived for sponsors who have an active NAEA membership that is valid through 6/30/2026. Cosponsors must also be active NAEA members.

START A NEW CHAPTER



Follow these steps and guidelines for establishing a new NAHS/NJAHS chapter at your school.

1. Consult your administrator to ensure that initiating an NAHS/ NJAHS chapter aligns with your school's policies. If you need help making the case for the value of starting a chapter, you can download a [letter of encouragement](#).

2. Establish bylaws for your NAHS/NJAHS chapter. (See sample Bylaws on [page 12](#).)

3. Invite qualifying students to join your chapter.

4. After you have your student roster finalized, register the chapter with NAEA. Sponsors can register their chapter in four easy ways:

- **Online:** Is your NAEA membership current through June 30? If not, click here to [join or renew](#) before establishing your chapter. If you're not yet an NAEA member, first create an NAEA account, and then click "[Start a NEW](#)" (not existing) NAHS/NJAHS Chapter.

- **Fax:** Print, complete, and fax the [registration form](#) to: 703-860-2960.

5. Once processing is complete, a confirmation email will be sent to the sponsor's email address. The chapter will electronically receive a letter of acknowledgement and digital membership cards for each member. Chapters will also instantly have access to all other NAHS/NJAHS benefits

ALREADY HAVE A CHAPTER?

Renew Your Chapter Registration for the 2024–25 School Year.

Register your chapter at the beginning of every school year to maintain active status. Chapter membership expires on June 30 each year, regardless of a chapter's date of registration. If you are a new sponsor or cosponsor for an existing chapter, please contact NAEA Member Services for support.

1. After you have your student roster finalized, renew your chapter registration with NAEA. Sponsors can register their chapter in four easy ways:

Please note: Chapter registration ends on June 30 each year, regardless of the date the chapter is established or renewed.

Student Membership Cards: After registering your chapter, you will receive an email with an attached file. This file is the membership card template for your registered student members for the program year. We have transitioned from physical to digital membership cards to make our process more efficient and environmentally friendly. If you require physical copies, please email nahs@arteducators.org to request them. Please allow up to four weeks to receive your membership cards in the mail. If you would like certificates, you can order them online via the NAHS store.

How to submit:

1. **Write a brief report** (400 words or less) of what your chapter is up to—this can include activities, fund-raising, projects, and/or community outreach.
2. **Choose up to 2 chapter photos** (images of students, activities, projects, etc.) and 5 images of student artwork (include photo of artwork only—no students in frame).
3. **Complete the online submission form** and upload your image attachments. You'll receive an automatic email confirmation after submitting the form.

Submission Deadlines: **November 15** (Winter Issue) and **March 15** (Spring Issue)

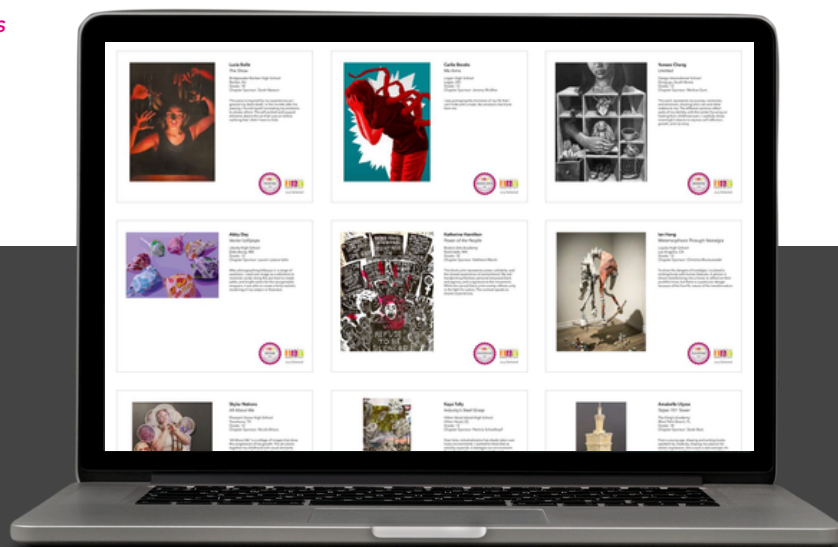

College for Creative Studies

The College for Creative Studies is pleased to announce the availability of 20 merit-based scholarships, each valued at \$4,000. These scholarships are disbursed at a rate of \$1,000 per year for a duration of 4 years. These scholarships are exclusively available to high school seniors who hold membership in the National Art Honor Society.

To secure this scholarship award, candidates are required to submit their National Art Honor Society certificate as part of the application process.

National Art Honor Society Member Scholarship (High School Juniors and Seniors)

The National Art Honor Society (NAHS) was established to recognize high school students for their dedication to the arts. Students with active NAHS membership are eligible to receive a \$1,500 scholarship.

Renewable for up to 4 years with 3.0 GPA at FIDM and consecutive attendance. Students must also maintain 12 units quarterly to qualify for scholarship renewal. Students may qualify for more than one scholarship but not to exceed the cost of tuition, books, and supplies.

National Art Honor Society Special Recognition Scholarship (High school Juniors and Seniors)

Students who have their work shown in a NAHS juried exhibition may receive an additional one-time \$1,500 scholarship. Nonrenewable.

9 TIPS FOR CHAPTER SUCCESS

1. **Art Education Workshops:** Conduct art workshops for local elementary students, providing hands-on art experiences and fostering creativity.
2. **Artist-in-Residence Program:** Invite local artists to meet with your chapter in person or virtually.
3. **Business Collaborations:** Partner with local businesses related to art to create joint projects, exhibitions, or campaigns that benefit students and the community.
4. **Career Exploration:** Share information about various art-related careers, organizing talks or workshops with professionals in the arts to inspire students and offer insights into potential career paths.
5. **Communications:** Have a regular column in the school newspaper or PTA newsletter concerning chapter activities. Take photos and submit highlights to NAHS News.
6. **Community Art Projects:** Incorporate community art service learning projects in your chapter to foster creativity and positively impact the broader community. Visit the NAHS website for a list of ideas.
7. **Museum Outreach:** Plan field trips to museums and galleries, where students can appreciate art and engage with the local artistic community and curators to learn about curation and exhibition.
8. **Social Justice Art:** Encourage students to create art that raises awareness about community issues and organize exhibitions or campaigns to promote positive change.
9. **Website and Social Media:** Create a website and active social media presence for your chapter, showcasing ongoing projects, events, student art, and accomplishments to engage the community and build support.

FUND-RAISING IDEAS

1. **Hold an auction** of original student artwork or reproductions. Be sure to designate a starting bid amount.
2. **Design and sell school spirit items** such as T-shirts, hoodies, ball caps, water bottles or sketchbooks.
3. **Create and sell a calendar** featuring member artwork.
4. **Set up a game night.** Give participants the opportunity to play and win unique art prizes.
5. **Sketch and sell caricatures** during lunch, athletic games, or community events.
6. **Host in-person or virtual art lessons.** Invite the community to take part in art education taught by student members. Accept donations for attendance.
7. **Create and sell craft items** for holidays (Halloween, Valentine's Day, etc.).
8. **Host a gift basket sale or raffle.** Take the gift baskets to a whole new level by adding personalized works of art!
9. **Design and sell a local coupon book** by working with local shops, restaurants, and/or stores.
10. **Create and sell a children's activity or a recipe book.**
11. **Take part in a restaurant fund-raiser night.** Work with a local restaurant so that part of the proceeds are donated back to the school.
12. **Create (or purchase) and sell graduation yard signs** for graduating seniors on campus.
13. **Have students refurbish and hand-paint used furniture**, such as wooden chairs, to create unique pieces for auction.

ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES OF NAHS/NJAHS CHAPTERS



Establishing clear roles and responsibilities for NAHS/NJAHS chapters is crucial for their success and efficiency. It ensures that each member understands their specific duties, promoting accountability and effective collaboration. Clear roles also facilitate smooth operations, help prevent misunderstandings, and enable the chapter to achieve its goals by leveraging the strengths and skills of its members. Ultimately, well-defined responsibilities foster a professional and organized environment that benefits all members and enhances the chapter's impact. Below is a list of suggested roles and responsibilities. Please note that these are not mandated or required, and each institution may organize its roles and responsibilities as needed.

NAHS/NJAHS Sponsors

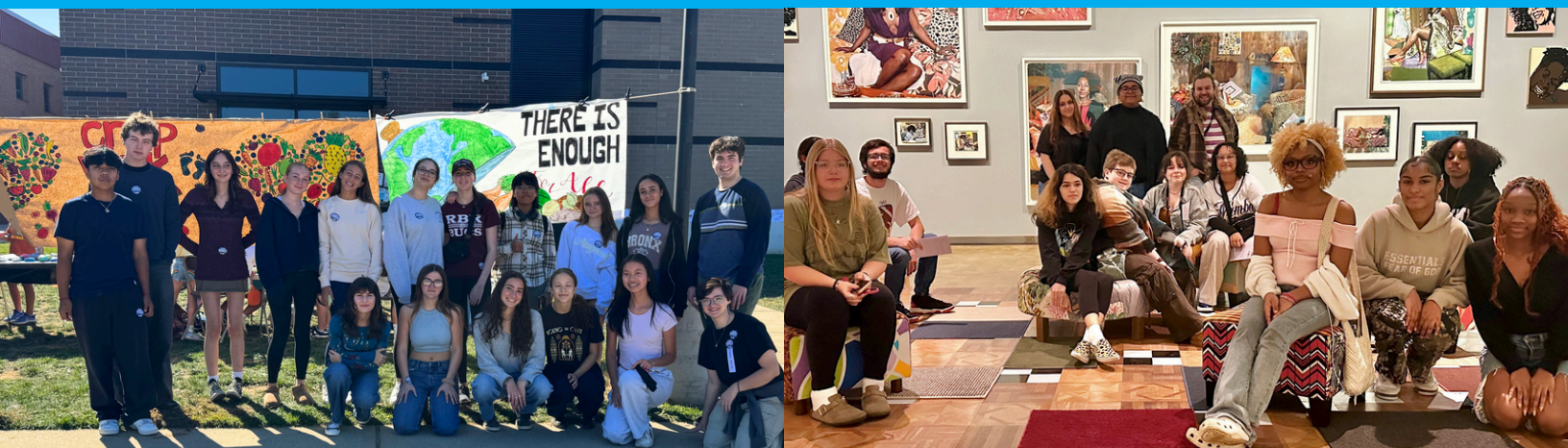
- **NAEA Member:** Must be an active NAEA member in good standing.
- **Guidance and Mentorship:** Provide advice and support to chapter officers and members.
- **Oversight and Compliance:** Ensure that the chapter adheres to NAHS/NJAHS Constitution guidelines and school regulations.
- **Supervision:** Approve and supervise chapter meetings, activities, and events.
- **Membership:** Recommend members to join the NAHS/NJAHS chapter. Criteria used to determine membership selection beyond faculty recommendation shall be set forth in this chapter's bylaws.

Elected Student Officers and/or Leaders

- **Planning:** Lead chapter meetings and set agendas.
- **Representation:** Represent the chapter at school and NAEA events.
- **Activities and Events:** Coordinate with NAHS/NJAHS sponsors and oversee all chapter activities. Organize and manage chapter events.
- **Connect:** Liaise with other school organizations and external partners.
- **Record Keeping:** Maintain accurate records of meetings, including minutes and attendance.
- **Communications:** Handle chapter correspondence and communications.
- **Membership:** Keep an updated member roster and manage chapter documentation.
- **Finances:** Maintain chapter's finances, including budgeting, fund-raising, and expense tracking.
- **Promotion:** Promote chapter events and activities through social media and other communication channels. Design and distribute promotional materials.

NAHS/NJAHS Chapter Members

- **Active Participation:** Attend meetings regularly and engage in chapter events and activities.
- **Committee Involvement:** Serve on committees to help plan and execute chapter projects and initiatives.
- **Advocacy and Outreach:** Promote the importance of art education within the school and community.
- **Support and Collaboration:** Work collaboratively with other members and officers to achieve the chapter's goals and mission.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF NAHS CHAPTER OFFICERS



Each officer plays a crucial role in the successful functioning and growth of the NAHS/NJAHS chapter, working together to promote artistic excellence, community engagement, and a vibrant artistic community. The following is a list of suggested NAHS/NJAHS Chapter Officers and descriptions of duties and responsibilities. Some chapters choose to have leadership commissions in lieu of officers. Please use and adapt to meet the needs of your school and chapter.

President

- **Provide leadership** and direction to the chapter.
- **Oversee chapter** meetings and activities.
- **Collaborate** with other officers and members to plan events and initiatives.
- **Represent** the chapter at school and community events.
- **Serve as a student liaison** between the chapter and school administration.

Secretary

- **Maintain accurate records** of chapter meetings, activities, and attendance.
- **Handle communication** and correspondence for the chapter.
- **Assist in documenting** and sharing information about chapter events and achievements.
- **Ensure communication** so chapter members are informed about upcoming events and opportunities.

Vice President

- **Support** the President in their duties and responsibilities. Assume the President's role in their absence.
- **Assist** in organizing and coordinating chapter activities and projects.
- **Encourage active participation** among chapter members.
- **Foster** a positive and inclusive atmosphere within the chapter.

Treasurer

- **Manage the chapter's finances** and budgets.
- **Keep track** of expenses and maintain financial records.
- **Work with** the chapter sponsor to ensure financial transparency and accountability.
- **Assist in fund-raising** efforts for chapter projects and activities.

Other Officers and Leadership Members

Additional officers may be necessary depending on the chapter's size and level of involvement. These officers may be assigned as needed, elected by the members, or combined with the duties of other officers. Some additional officers in chapters may be:

Historian/Parliamentarian

- **Document** and preserve records of chapter events and activities through photographs, videos, and written accounts.
- **Create** and maintain a visual or digital archive of the chapter's accomplishments.
- **Compile materials** for NAHS News showcasing the chapter's achievements.
- **Collaborate** with the Secretary to ensure accurate documentation of events and milestones.

Chair for Activities

- **Coordinate** and plan various art-related events and activities for the chapter, such as workshops, fund-raisers, and exhibitions.
- **Collaborate** with local organizations to plan and execute art-related community service projects.
- **Organize and manage** event logistics, such as creating schedules, securing venues, and coordinating with vendors or guest artists.
- **Promote events** through effective communication and collaboration with the Public Relations Officer.

Chair for Public Relations

- **Promote** the chapter's activities and events within the school and the community.
- **Utilize social media** and other communication channels to raise awareness about the chapter's initiatives.
- **Design promotional materials** and announcements for chapter events.
- **Collaborate** with school media or press outlets to feature the chapter's achievements.

Chair for Awards and Ceremonies

- **Communicate award details** to chapter members and sponsors.
- **Collaborate** with committee members to coordinate award selections and nominations.
- **Lead the planning** for member induction and awards ceremonies, overseeing logistics and scheduling.

Article I: Name and Purpose

Section 1. The name of this chapter shall be the _____ Chapter of the National Art Honor Society.

Section 2. The purpose of the chapter shall be to:

- A. Inspire and recognize those students who have shown outstanding ability in art;
- B. Foster excellence and a dedicated spirit to the pursuit of art;
- C. Further creative abilities and talents of the Society's members, as well as the school's entire student art enrollment;
- D. Aid members in working toward the attainment of their highest potential in an art area;
- E. Bring art to the attention of the school and community;
- F. Increase an awareness of art in relation to other areas of the school curriculum; and
- G. Further aesthetic awareness in all aspects of the school's total program.

Article II: Local Chapters

Section 1. Public, charter, private, and virtual schools, homeschool networks, and community-based nonprofit art organizations are eligible to apply for charter through the National Art Education Association (NAEA).

Article III: Membership

Section 1. Membership in this chapter shall be based upon art scholarship, service, and character.

Section 2. To be eligible for selection to membership in this chapter, the candidate must be a high school student and have completed a period equivalent to 1 semester of art in this school.

Section 3. An eligible candidate shall have a minimum art scholarship average of B, or this school's equivalent. This is the national minimum standard of achievement required for eligibility and shall remain fixed.

Section 4. Members may remain active during such time when there is no art on their class schedule.

Section 5. Students enrolled in homeschool on a full-time basis and who meet all other eligibility requirements may be considered for NAHS membership.

Article IV: Selection of Members

Section 1. The selection of members to this chapter of the National Art Honor Society shall be by recommendation from the art faculty members of this school who are members in good standing of the National Art Education Association (NAEA). Criteria used to determine membership selection beyond faculty recommendation shall be set forth in this chapter's bylaws.

Section 2. Any member who falls below the standards that are the basis for selection shall be promptly warned. If during the next regular marking period of the school, the member fails to meet the standards used as the basis for selection to the Society, the case shall be passed upon by the chapter council.

Section 3. When a member is dismissed, they must be notified and the membership card returned to the Society sponsor.

Section 4. An active member of the National Art Honor Society who transfers from this school will be given a letter indicating the status of their membership, signed by the sponsor and principal.

Section 5. An active member of the National Art Honor Society who transfers to this school will be accepted for membership in this chapter. This transfer member must maintain the membership requirements for this chapter in order to retain membership.

Section 6. NAEA does not participate in matters of member nonselection or dismissal.

Article V: Officers

Section 1. The officers of this chapter shall be President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer (these could be combined), Historian/Parliamentarian, Chair for Awards and Ceremonies, Chair for Public Relations, and Chair for Activities.

Section 2. A majority of votes cast shall be necessary to elect any officer of this chapter.

Section 3. It shall be the duty of the President to preside at the meetings of this chapter.

Section 4. The Vice President shall preside in the absence of the President and serve as the chapter's Program Chair.

Section 5. The chapter Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings, a record of all business, and all records on file.

Section 6. The Treasurer shall receive and disburse all funds of the chapter and keep an accurate account of receipts and disbursements in accordance with school regulations.

Section 7. A chapter council shall consist of the Chapter President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and the Chapter Sponsor.

Article VI: Supervision

Section 1. An art faculty member (sponsor) shall be designated to supervise and provide guidance for this chapter on a daily basis.

Section 2. The sponsor shall be a member of the art faculty employed by the school.

Section 3. The post of sponsor shall be voluntary.

Section 4. The sponsors must be National Art Education Association members in good standing.

Section 5. The activities of this chapter will be subject to the approval of the sponsor and the principal. The principal shall have the final right to approve all activities and decisions of this chapter.

Article VII: Meetings

Section 1. The regular meetings of this chapter shall be held during the school year on days designated by the chapter council and approved by the principal.

Section 2. The officers of the chapter shall be elected at the last regular meeting of the year.

Section 3. Special meetings, approved by the chapter council, may be called by the President.

Section 4. All meetings shall be open meetings and shall be held under the supervision of the sponsor.

Section 5. This chapter shall conduct its meetings according to *Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised*, in all points not expressly provided for in the constitution of this chapter.

Article VIII: Membership Fees

Section 1. A yearly NAHS membership fee of \$5 per student shall be forwarded to the National Art Honor Society at the NAEA National Office.

Section 2. A yearly school sponsorship fee is required for each NAHS chapter and entitles the chapter sponsor to all the rights and privileges of one active NAEA membership, including all NAEA member and NAHS chapter benefits. The school sponsorship fee is waived for sponsors who are already active NAEA members. Cosponsors must be active NAEA members.

Section 3. School sponsorship fees and student membership fees may be paid by the individual, school, community group, or agency. Fees and registration forms must be submitted to NAEA by the chapter sponsor.

Section 4. School sponsorship and student membership fees are nonrefundable and nontransferable.

Section 5. Local chapters may establish and collect annual dues at their discretion for local operating expenses.

Article IX: Bylaws

Section 1. A chapter may wish to include bylaws to amplify sections of its constitution. Bylaws do not need to be approved by the National Council if they are consistent with regulations outlined in the constitution.

Section 2. A current copy of the local chapter bylaws must be filed with the NAEA Office.

Article X: The National Council

Section 1. The National Council shall be: the Secondary Division Director, the Middle Level Division Director, and two Members-at-Large from the general Secondary and Middle Level membership of NAEA. Members-at-Large shall be appointed by the NAEA President. The NAEA Executive Director shall be an ex-officio member.

Section 2. Terms of office for members of the National Council shall be 2 years.

Article XI: Constitution

Section 1. NAEA reserves the right to amend this constitution based on input from the NAEA staff and the National Council.

- D. Aid members in working toward the attainment of their highest potential in an art area;

- F. Increase an awareness of art in relation to other areas of the school curriculum; and
- G. Further aesthetic awareness in all aspects of the school's total program.

Article II: Local Chapters

Section 4. Members may remain active during such time when there is no art on their class schedule.

Section 5. Students enrolled in homeschool on a full-time basis and who meet all other eligibility requirements may be considered for NJAHS membership.

Article IV: Selection of Members

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Section 2. Any member who falls below the standards that are the basis for selection shall be promptly warned. If during the next regular marking period of the school, the member fails to meet the standards used as the basis for selection to the Society, the case shall be passed upon by the chapter council.

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Section 2. Terms of office for members of the National Council shall be 2 years.

Article XI: Constitution

Section 1. NAEA reserves the right to amend this constitution based on input from the NAEA staff and the National Council.

SUGGESTED BYLAWS

Bylaws outline the obligations of memberships that are required to be a part of your institution's chapter of NAHS/NJAHS. This guideline for the creation of bylaws helps ensure that your chapter upholds the National Standards as defined in the Chapter Constitution (pages 10–11).

Section 1. A chapter should include bylaws to amplify sections of its constitution. Bylaws do not need to be approved by the National Council if they are consistent with regulations outlined in the constitution. A current copy of the local chapter bylaws must be filed with NAEA.

Section 2. To remain a member in good standing, a member must pay dues and complete ____ service hours in the visual arts each year. (You may adjust the number of hours to fit your school or community needs.)

Section 3. Annual dues of \$ ____ will be collected from each member. (The amount you charge should cover chapter registration fees and any other expenses you expect to incur.)

Section 4. Attendance is required at meetings to maintain membership and privileges. (You may set the number that may be missed with cause or adjust the meeting frequency to fit your school's schedule.)

Section 5. All members must participate in ____ of our projects, activities, and fund-raisers. (You set the number or percentage of events required.)

Section 6. For the NAHS and NJAHS officers, attendance is also required at any executive meetings called outside of the regularly scheduled meetings.

Section 7. To graduate with NAHS honors and earn the right to wear a cord, pin, or tassel at graduation, a member must remain in good standing until the graduation date.

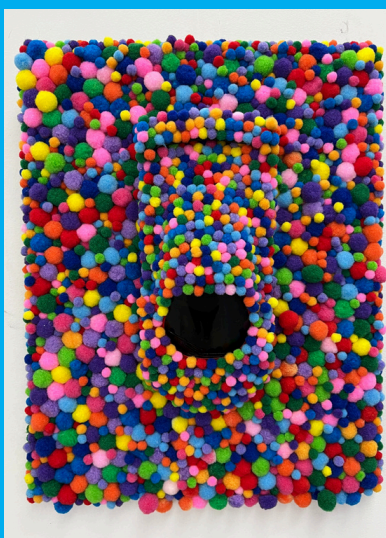
Section 8. Members must retain a ____ average in an honors or AP class or ____ in a regular class. (Many schools require a higher GPA in art classes than the B required by the National Constitution. You may adjust the requirement or leave it at the required B average.)

Section 9. Members must have and maintain a ____ cumulative average in all other subjects. (Many schools require an overall minimum GPA. This change is not required, and the required minimum should not be as high as the art GPA.)

Section 10. Members may remain active during such time when there are no visual arts on their class schedules as long as they fulfill all of the other requirements each year.

Section 11. In the event of an infraction of rules, a review by the officers and sponsors will be conducted. If the individual in question is an officer, they will not participate in the decision-making process. This applies to all community laws as well as school and chapter rules.
