NAHS STATE LEADER REPRESENTATIVES

NAEA's NAHS State Leader Representatives are a group of dedicated art educators who serve as the voice for NAHS and NJAHS sponsors and students within their respective states. These representatives play a crucial role in advocating for the needs and interests of the National Art Honor Societies.

Below is a general description of the duties and responsibilities within this role:

- Establish and maintain regular contact with all NAEA NAHS Chapters in the state.
- Serve as liaison between NAEA and state-level NAHS Chapters.
- Virtually attend all NAEA NAHS State Leader Representatives meetings.

NAHS/NJAHS National Council

Secondary Level NAEA members are invited to apply for the volunteer leadership position of Secondary Level Member-At-Large on the National Art Honor Society (NAHS) National Council. Applications will open in January 2026 and close in February 2026.

About the National Council: Members of the National Council include the NAEA Executive Director (ex-officio), the Secondary Division Director, Middle Level Division Director, and two Members-At-Large—one from among Secondary NAHS chapter sponsors and one from among Middle Level NJAHS chapter sponsors.

Qualifications: Must be active members of NAEA with a registered NAHS/NJAHS chapter.

Terms of Service and Appointment: Members serve 2-year terms. The next term will begin immediately following the 2026 NAEA National Convention in Chicago, IL, and conclude after the 2028 NAEA National Convention in Phoenix, AZ.

National Council Members-At-Large are selected from applications submitted and appointed by the NAEA President. Members meet annually during the NAEA National Convention and participate in three virtual meetings per year. Total time commitment is approximately 6 hours per year.
