- » Art educators have opportunities to meet with other visual arts specialists, as well as specialists in other subjects.
- » Visual arts educators have opportunities for professional development and participation in professional learning communities.
- » Professional learning enables the development and alignment of curriculum collaboratively across preK-12.
- » Professional learning provides opportunities to learn about portfolio development, college admissions criteria, and career readiness for visual and media arts pathways.

Recognize Visual Arts Teachers as Core Professionals:

- » Acknowledge visual arts teachers as essential, highly trained professionals in the school community.
- » Nurture meaningful relationships with educators outside of the field to build rapport for the profession and the field.
- » Commit to consistent hiring and assessment practices for art educators, ensuring that all students have access to highly qualified art educators.
